Settlers	A person who moves with others to live na new country or area.













The Roman Empire




These gladiators are racing chariots in an amphitheatre.

Romans built sophisticated bathhouses with underfloor heating systems (a hypercaust).





Romans built roads that were straight which allowed troops and military supplies to move quickly through Britain. The roads were then used for trade and to transport goods.
